

Name: Nicoleta Pitig

Position: School Vice-Principal

1. How did you adjust to being the school vice-principal?

I can't say there was or there is any adjusting, taking into consideration the fact that I've always been a person deeply involved in the school's life, even when I was a school inspector. I have never wanted "the rupture" from the class, from the profession that I have chosen – teaching. I would say that the position of vice-principal brought along new responsibilities, both at an institutional level, but mostly in my relationship with students. From my point of view the position of vice-principal represents a combination between listening to students' wishes and respecting the rigors of the school regulation, a harmonization of individuals for the common benefit.

2. What things do you miss from the time when you were a teacher?

I am and I will always be a teacher devoted to this profession, but every position requires sacrifices. First of all I would like to be able to assign more time for the preparation of the lessons, of the classes that I teach. Geography is a discipline that implies a permanent update of information, a visualisation of the phenomena that occur in nature.

3. What is your relationship with the students?

My relationship with the students is a "democratic" one, of fellowship and mutual respect. I see students as "partners" in the educational process and I think that without them, teachers wouldn't have "the object of work".

4. What are your plans for the future?

My plans for the future are related to maintaining a quality education at the school level, promoting the image of the school among gymnasium pupils from the entire county, setting a collaborative relationship and mutual respect between students and teachers.

5. How would you describe the students in our college?

I would describe them in a few short words: modest, diligent, serious, responsible.

6. What would you like to change in the students' behaviour?

I would like to change the students' attitude towards school, teachers, colleagues, and especially towards themselves; they must not forget their purpose as students – studying.

7. Do you have some tips for us, the students?

If you study hard, you do it for yourselves, not for the school. That's why a thorough training will be beneficial for your future activity.

Cambridge exams

Cambridge Exams at CNIS - second anniversary

In March 2012 we will be hosting the 6th session of Cambridge Exams in our school, which means that we celebrate two years since the Cambridge Exams Closed Centre was set up here, at CNIS. Almost 250 candidates have already taken their FCE or CAE exams, and another 67 are about to do the same, in March. The teachers of English worked hard for the school to be authorised as an examination centre, and they still do, since each session involves a lot of preparation, time and dedication.

Let me tell you about the beginning. Well, it was pretty hard. After getting the approval of the British Council in Cluj-Napoca, we had to convince our colleagues from other high schools that we are trustworthy, that the Cambridge Exams which were to be held at the "Ioan Slavici" National College were the genuine ones. Quite many of them were very supportive, encouraging their students to register for the exams in our school, thus helping us reach the minimum number of candidates needed for a closed centre to be established. During the first session (June 2010) there were candidates from all the major high schools in the city, and the teachers who invigilated were not only coming from CNIS, but also from "Mihai Eminescu" National College, "Doamna Stanca" National College and "Johan Ettinger" German High School. Everything went well and starting with the second session the Closed Centre has been trusted and appreciated by students and teachers from the entire county, and even from Maramures.

In case you didn't know, the Cambridge Exams are recognised by the Ministry of Education, which means that if you are the happy owner of a Cambridge Certificate, you no longer have to take the Linguistic Competence Exam, as part of the Baccalaureate. But this is only one of the countless advantages of possessing such a diploma. The Cambridge Exams have recently celebrated a century of existence, and over these so many years they have built an outstanding reputation, therefore being approved and accepted by universities all over the world.

If you're planning to take a Cambridge exam, you should know that there are three sessions every year: in March, June and December. To find out the exact dates, the exam fees and the registration procedure, all you have to do is go to the school's website (www.cnislavici.ro). The page called Cambridge exams is constantly updated so that you will know when and how to register.

You might be thinking of studying abroad or getting a scholarship in a foreign country, or you might be going even further and realise how big an advantage holding a Cambridge Certificate would be for you future career. But you could also be putting yourself to test, pushing your brain and ambition really hard, just to find out what you are capable of. Whatever your reasons, I encourage you to give it a try and succeed. After all, not everyone can do it, and if you can, what's stopping you?

I took the Cambridge exam because I am considering going to college in Denmark, and an English Certificate is usually required if you are planning to study in a foreign country. 

Lucid dreaming

The basic definition of lucid dreaming is being aware that you are dreaming. When lucidity is at a high level, you are aware that everything experienced in the dream is occurring in your mind, that there is no real danger. With low-level lucidity you may be aware that you are dreaming, but not enough to realize that the people are dream representations, or that you can suffer no physical harm.

Lucid dreaming is an extraordinarily vivid form of mental

imagery, so realistic that the trick is to realize it is a mental construct. It is no surprise, therefore, that many people use lucid dreaming to rehearse for success in waking life.

The creative potential of dreams is legendary. The brain is highly active in REM(rapid eye movement) sleep and unconstrained by sensory input .This allows thought to take on forms that are rare in waking life, manifesting as enhanced creativity, or defective thinking depending on one's point of view ("One man's creativity is another's brain damage." - Roland Fisher). Another study comparing a various of kinds of experiences including daydreams, memories of actual events, and dreams, found that dreams were judged as being significantly more creative than both daydreams and memories.

Moreover, lucidity in unpleasant dreams or nightmares can transform habitual fear into conscious courage. Dreams of death can actually be insightful experiences about life, rebirth, and transcendence. While awake, sensory and perceptual information governs our model. While dreaming, our bodies are paralyzed and our brain builds a world model based on a secondary source: our assumptions, motivations, and expectations. More importantly, lucid dreams can be inspirations for how to act and improve in reality.

Lucid dreaming is a skill you can develop, like learning a new language (the two essentials are motivation and effort). The best predictor of success with lucid dreaming is the ability to remember dreams. This, too, is a skill you can develop.

Experiment, observe, and persevere- - lucid dreaming is easier than you may think.

The secret from beyond

Well, not long ago, back in the 70's when the old bridge over the Somes was blown up and torn apart(near the actual Decebal bridge), a tunnel was found at the foot of the bridge. It was very close to the place where the actual Public Finances headquarter building is. The tunnel was built out of bricks in a vault-like shape and was about one and a half meters high, high enough for a horse to fit in.

But what was its purpose? Considering that it was secret, recently discovered and given what the locals say, it was likely used in case of emergency by the nobles to run from invaders. Some say that even Pintea the Brave used it to escape the prison from Satu Mare! Unfortunately, this tunnel is old and in many parts, the ground collapsed and has made it impossible to access....

There are many legends about this tunnel, but the best one is from a local in Mediesu Aurit who said that Mihai the Brave used it to outrun the Othmans. But what was special about this is the way he did it: he turned the horses' horseshoes backwards in order to confuse the Othmans and make it looks as though he only entered the tunnel and never left.

I am proud to have visited the castle in Mediesu Aurit and even though it's in ruins, it's also a place full of history!

Movie Review: 'Real Steel'

"Real Steel" is "Rocky" with robots that look like "Transformers," managed by a "Raging Bull" washout in need of a "Cinderella Man" comeback that's complicated by "The Champ" and "Paper Moon" sorts of parent-child issues, with a sweet bit of "Wall-E"-styled scrap metal who never pulls his punches. Perhaps "Reel Steal" would be the better title.

The film stars Hugh Jackman, Evangeline Lilly, Dakota Goyo and Atom as, respectively, the-down-on-his-luck-former-boxer-turned-fighting-robot manager, the almost-given-up-on-romance-but-I-can-fix-any-broken-bot-you-drag-in-here beauty, the I-wish-I-had-a-better-dad-but-at-least-he's-in-the-robot-game kid and the won't-someone-just-believe-in-me blue-eyed boxing bot.

Out of that lineup the name to remember is Goyo's. He's a cheeky Canadian youngster with soulful eyes that move from mischief to sadness with a remarkable ease. In the role of 11-year-old, newly motherless Max, he is the saving grace of "Real Steel," helping not only to bring out the humanity in Atom — Max just knows the bot has the circuitry of a champion — but sparking a flicker of life in Jackman, who's had a tough time getting his acting to outshine his muscle-flexing prowess and his model good looks.

Director Shawn Levy, of course, deserves some of the credit for what works. As a filmmaker, Levy has specialized in comedy. With "Real Steel," he moves into the action game. Maybe metal should be his métier, because Levy, with Sugar Ray Leonard adding some punch to the boxing sequences, makes you actually care about the robots, or at least Atom.

The time frame has been slightly fast-forwarded to 2020 and from the looks of it the economy has only gotten worse, with veteran cinematographer Mauro Fiore ("Avatar") capturing a down-market Americana that feels depressingly real. Meanwhile, mass entertainment has gone to extremes, replacing hard bodies with steel robots so that boxing can be even more brutal. Like video games, humans hold the controls, they just don't have to feel the pain.

Charlie (Jackman) is a consistent loser on the circuit, carting around his bots — and pieces — in an 18-wheeler, making bad bets and usually

running out rather than paying up. The one slip-up that surprises him is Max, the son he fathered and had forgotten.

The kid's aunt wants custody; her husband wants a kid, and Charlie wants to make a fast buck. So a backroom deal puts money in Charlie's hands and Max in his care for the summer. The kid's no pushover, he wants a piece of Charlie's take, and after he discovers Atom in a garbage dump, this young bot boxing fanatic wants a shot at getting his guy into the game. And thus the journey toward enlightenment begins.

It's a grungy world of double-dealing with villains of various stripes, the requisite fighting foes to root against with the two-headed Twin Cities, the weirdest; the high-tech monstrous Zeus, the best. The fights do go on and on, but they're more exciting to watch than what Michael Bay's managed with "Transformers."

As Charlie, Jackman is mostly surface gloss — he knows how to work a greasy tee and a bad attitude, glaring and growling at everyone. He softens slightly with Lilly's Bailey (so nice to see her bruised, buff beauty back since "Lost" wrapped). But it is with Goyo that Jackman warms up. Their father-son spats, truly some of the film's best sparring, is what gives it heart. Not "Rocky" heart, or "Raging Bull" heart, mind you, but "Real" enough.
